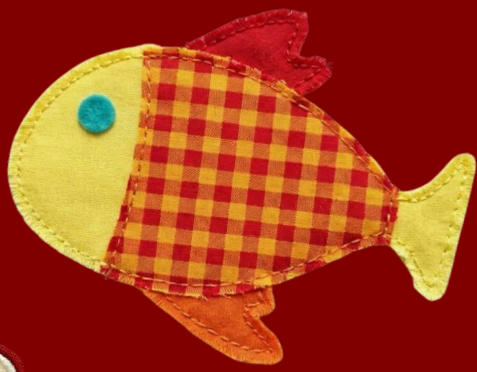

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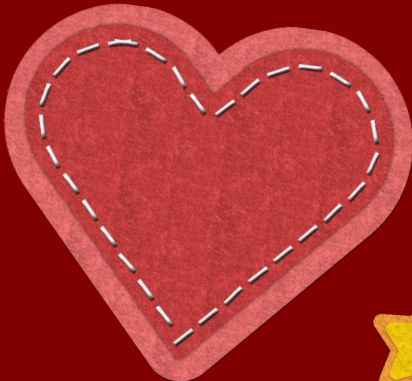

Randolph Bradshaw was born July 14, 1970, in Chicago to Lydia Bradshaw and Marvin Evans. A South Side native, Randy grew up attending Paul Revere Elementary and Hirsch High School.

His path took a few turns. He served as a Marine in 1988, explored law enforcement in the '90s, then found a home behind the barber chair. Barbering gave him a place to talk, laugh, build friendships and make people feel seen.

In 2010, Randy joined the Cook County Sheriff's Department and later became an Investigator. He wore the uniform with pride, but stayed the same calm, cool Randy people knew everywhere else.

Randy loved bringing people together. He kept things simple, cared deeply and took pride in being someone others could lean on.

He left us on September 1, 2026, at 56. What stays is the love, the laughs and the care he gave so freely. If you knew Randy, chances are he showed up for you in some way.

We hope the best of Randy stays with all of us. Check in. Make peace when you can. Help where you're able. Laugh often. Love people while they're here.

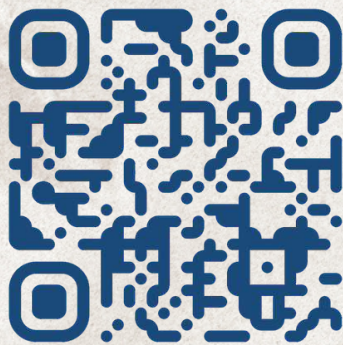
Life will keep moving, changing and giving us new reasons to hold one another close. Randy's spirit lives on in the care we give, the love we share and the good we carry forward.
